3 Hazard(s) identification

Hazard Information for people and the environment: Pressurized container: protect from sunlight and do not expose to temperatures exceeding 50 °C, i.e. electric lights. Do not pierce or burn, even after use. Extremely flammable liquid and vapor in a pressurized container. Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame. Has narcotizing effect.

Risk phrases: Extremely flammable. Irritating to eyes. Vapours may cause drowsiness and dizziness

Safety phrases: Keep out of the reach of children. Keep away from sources of ignition - No smoking. Do not breathe gas/fumes/ vapour/spray.
